### **Preparedness Plan Introduction**

Governor Whitmer's <u>Executive Order 2020-142</u> "provides a structure to support all schools in Michigan as they plan for a return of pre-K-12 education in the fall. Under the order, school districts must adopt a COVID-19 Preparedness and Response Plan laying out how they will cope with the disease across the various phases of the <u>Michigan Safe Start Plan</u>. In turn, the accompanying Michigan Return to School Roadmap offers a guide to the types of safety protocols appropriate during each phase. There's no one-size-fits-all solution: What works in Lansing may not work in Sault Sainte Marie. Districts will retain the flexibility to tailor their instruction to their particular needs and to the disease conditions present in their regions." (EO-2020-142)

Each district (public, public school academy (PSA), nonpublic, and intermediate school district (ISD) that educates pre-K-12 students) shall submit a single completed Assurance Document and Preparedness Plan to its Board in time for approval by August 15 or seven days before the first day of school, whichever comes first. This template, when completed, serves as a single Assurance Document and Preparedness Plan.

The Preparedness Plan will be collected by the Intermediate School District for public school districts, the authorizing body for public school academies, or the chief/ designated school administrator for nonpublic schools for transmission to the State Superintendent of Public Instruction and State Treasurer by August 17, 2020. Additionally, this Preparedness Plan must be posted on the district's/PSA's, or nonpublic school's public website home page no later than August 17, 2020. A single application should be filed by the district rather than multiple applications for individual schools within a district.

### **Preparedness Plan Assurances**

Michigan International Prep School is a public cyber school, but if Michigan International Prep School changes to have traditional buildings, the District agrees to meet all of the following requirements of Executive Order 2020-142 as listed below.

- ✓ The District assures that when it provides in-person instruction to its students without disabilities, the district must also provide in-person instruction to its students with disabilities, consistent with their individualized education programs (IEPs).
- ✓ The District assures that when schools are closed to in-person instruction, districts must strive in good faith and to the extent practicable, based upon available resources, technology, training, and curriculum, as well as the circumstances presented by COVID-19, to provide equal access to any alternative modes of instruction to students with disabilities from birth through age 26. This assurance includes the provision of auxiliary services under section 1296 of the Revised School Code, MCL 380.1296.
- ✓ The District assures that while any state of emergency or disaster related to the COVID-19 pandemic continues, it shall comply with guidance from the United States Department of Education, including its Office of Civil Rights and Office of Special Education and Rehabilitative Services, and the Michigan Department of Education concerning the delivery of alternative modes of instruction to students with disabilities in light of the impact of COVID-19.
- ✓ The District assures that it shall, to the extent practicable and necessary, make individualized determinations whether and to what extent compensatory services may be needed for students with disabilities in light of the school closures during the 2019–2020 school year.
- ✓ The District assures that during Phase 1, 2, or 3 of the Michigan Safe Start Plan it will close its buildings (if any) to anyone except: (a) District employees or contractors necessary to conduct minimum basic school operations consistent with a Preparedness Plan, including those employers or contractors necessary to facilitate alternative modes of instruction, such as distributing materials and equipment or performing other necessary in-person functions. (b) our Food-service workers preparing food for distribution to students or their families. (c) Licensed child-care providers and the families that they serve, if providers follow all emergency protocols identified by the state.
- ✓ The District assures that during Phase 1, 2, or 3 of the *Michigan Safe Start Plan* it will suspend athletics, after-school activities, inter-school activities, and busing.
- ✓ The District assures that during Phase 1, 2, or 3 of the Michigan Safe Start Plan it will provide for the continued pay of school employees while redeploying staff to provide meaningful work in the context of the Preparedness Plan, subject to any applicable requirements of a collective bargaining agreement.
- ✓ The District assures that in Phases 1, 2, or 3 of the Michigan Safe Start Plan it will provide for the continuation of food distribution to eligible students.
- ✓ The District assures that during Phase 4 of the Michigan Safe Start Plan it willprohibit indoor assemblies that bring together students from more than one classroom.
- ✓ The District assures cooperation with the local public health department if a confirmed case of COVID-19 is identified, and agrees to collect the contact information for any close contacts of the affected individual from two days before he or she showed symptoms to the time when he or she was last present in school.

### **Preparedness Plan**

Michigan International Prep School will provide full remote instruction to students in Phase 1,2,3,4 and 5. Devices and Internet options will be provided to all students and all students will access instruction remotely.

Michigan International Prep will implement facial covering requirements in Phase 4 that at a minimum require the wearing of face coverings, except during meals and unless face coverings cannot be medically tolerated, for: By adhering to to following to Michigan Safe Start and district guidelines:

i.) All staff and all students in grades preK-12 when on a school bus. ii) All staff and all students in grades preK-12 when in indoor hallways and common areas.

iii) All staff when in classrooms.

ix) All students in grades 6 and up when in classrooms.

x) All students in grades kindergarten through grade 5 unless students remain with their classes throughout the school day and do not come into close contact with students in another class.

#### 2. Hygiene

Please describe how you will implement the **requirements** for hygiene protocols

Michigan International Prep School will implement the following requirement to adhere to the Return to School Roadmap and CDC guidelines:

- Provide adequate supplies to support healthy hygiene behaviors (including soap, hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol for safe use by staff and students, paper towels, tissues, and signs reinforcing proper handwashing techniques).
- Teach and reinforce handwashing with soap and water for at least 20 seconds and/or the safe use of hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.
- Systematically and frequently check and refill soap and hand sanitizers.
- Students and teachers must have scheduled handwashing with soap and water every 2-3 hours.
- Limit sharing of personal items and supplies such as writing utensils.
- Keep students' personal items separate and in individually labeled cubbies, containers, or lockers.
- Limit use of classroom materials to small groups and disinfect between use, or provide adequate supplies to assign for individual student use.
- Procure portable handwashing and/or hand sanitizing stations to set up throughoutschool buildings.
- Space desks six feet apart in classrooms.
- In classrooms where large tables are utilized, space students as far apart as feasible.
- Arrange all desks facing the same direction toward the front of the classroom.
- Teachers will maintain six feet of spacing between themselves and students as much as possible.
- Family members or other guests are not allowed in the school building except under extenuating circumstances determined by district and school officials.
- Post signage to indicate proper social distancing.
- Floor tape or other markers will be used where line formation is anticipated.
- Provide social distancing floor/seating markings in waiting and reception areas.
- Post signs on the doors of restrooms to indicate proper social distancing and hand hygiene techniques.
- Adult guests entering the building will be screened for symptoms, wear a facial covering, and wash/sanitize hands prior to entering. Strict records, including date and time, will be kept of non-school employees or other visitors entering and exiting the building.

#### 3. Cleaning

Please describe how you will implement the cleaning **requirements** for cleaning protocols from the *Return to School Roadmap* (p. 27).

Michigan International Prep School will implement the following cleaning requirements to adhere to the Return to School Roadmap and CDC guidelines:

- Frequently touched surfaces including light switches, doors, benches, bathrooms, will undergo cleaning at least every four hours with either an EPA-approved disinfectant or diluted bleach solution.
- Libraries, computer labs, arts, and other handson classrooms will undergo cleaning after every class period with either an EPA-approved disinfectant or diluted bleach solution.
- Student desks will be wiped down with either an EPA-approved disinfectant or diluted bleach solution after every class period.
- Michigan International Prep School does not have playground equipment on campus.
- Ensure safe and correct use and storage of cleaning and disinfection products, including storing products securely away from children, and with adequate ventilation when staff use products.
- Staff will wear gloves, surgical masks, and face shield when performing all cleaning activities.

#### 4. Athletics

Michigan International Prep School does not have athletic programs.

#### 5. Screening

Michigan International Prep School will implement the following screening requirements to adhere to the Return to School Roadmap, Local Health Department and CDC guidelines:

- MIPS will cooperate with the local public health department regarding implementing protocols for screening students and staff.
- MIPS will identify and designate a quarantine area and a staff person to care for students who become ill at school.
- Students who become ill with symptoms of COVID-19 will be placed in an identified quarantine area with a surgical mask in place until they can be picked up. Identified school staff caring for these children should wear a surgical mask, with the exception of students with special needs requiring aerosolized procedures in which an N95 mask is required.
- Symptomatic students sent home from school will be kept home until they have tested negative or have completely recovered according to CDC guidelines.
- Staff will conduct daily self-examinations, including a temperature check, prior to coming to work. If they exhibit any respiratory or gastrointestinal symptoms, or have a temperature of 100.4 or greater, they should stay home.
- A monitoring form for screening employees/ students will be required daily upon arrival tolabs.
- Families are encouraged to check their child's temperature at home every morning using oral, tympanic, or temporal scanners; students with a temperature of 100.4 or greater should stay home and consider coronavirus testing if symptoms of COVID-19 are present.
- Families are encouraged to monitor their children for symptoms of COVID-19. The presence of any symptoms, including cough or shortness of breath, should prompt the family to keep the student home from school and to follow up with a primary care provider.

#### 6. Testing

Please describe how you will implement the **requirements** for testing protocols from the *Return to School Roadmap* (p. 25).

Michigan International Prep School will implement the following testing requirements to adhere to the Return to School Roadmap, Local Health Department and CDC guidelines:

- MIPS will cooperate with the local public health department regarding implementing protocols for screening students and staff.
- Students who develop a fever or become ill with COVID-19 symptoms at school will weara
  mask and be transported by their parent or guardian, emergency contact, or ambulance if
  clinically unstable, for off-site testing.
- Staff who develop a fever or become ill with COVID-19 symptoms at school will wear a mask and be transported for off-site testing.
- Symptomatic students and staff sent home from school will be kept home until they havetested negative for COVID-19, or have been released from isolation according to CDC guidelines.
- Families will be notified of the presence of any laboratory positive or clinically diagnosed cases of COVID-19 in the classroom and/or school to encourage closer observation for any symptoms at home.
- In the event of a lab or clinically diagnosed case of COVID-19, immediate efforts will be made to contact any close contacts (those who spent more than 15 minutes less than six feet in close proximity to the student or staff member) so that they can be quarantined for 14 days athome.

- Students and staff will be closely monitored for any symptoms of COVID-19. At this time, empiric testing of all students or staff members in the class is not recommended. Only those that develop symptoms require testing for COVID-19.
- Parents and guardians are encouraged to check students' temperature at home everymorning using oral, tympanic (ear), or temporal scanners; students with a temperature of 100.4 or greater must stay home and consider coronavirus testing.
- Parents and guardians are encouraged to monitor for symptoms of COVID-19. The presence of any unexplained symptoms, including cough or shortness of breath, should prompt the parent or guardian to keep the student home from school and to follow up with their primary care provider.
- MIPS will cooperate with the local public health department if a confirmed case of COVID-19 is identified, and in particular, will collect the contact information for any close contacts of the affected individual from two days before he or she showed symptoms to the time when he or she was last present at the school.
- MIPS will notify local health officials, staff, and students immediately of any possible case of COVID-19 while maintaining confidentiality consistent with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and other applicable federal and state privacy laws.
- The Local Health Department will initiate contact tracing, following regular public health practice. Anyone who was within close contact of the case (less than six feet apart for 15+ minutes) will be required to self quarantine for up to 14 days after exposure. Local health MIPS will help the local health department by collecting data and contact information of those exposed.
- Employees/Students with a confirmed case of COVID-19 should only return to the school after they are no longer infectious. Local health officials will provide instruction about return to work, using the most current guidelines from the CDC for this determination

#### 7. Busing and Student Transportation
