Dear MIPS Families.

As required by Michigan State Law, Michigan International Prep School (MIPS) is providing families with important information about safe firearm storage practices to help protect children in our community.

Michigan's Secure Storage Law

Michigan law requires the secure storage of firearms when minors may be present. This means:

- Firearms must be stored in locked containers or secured with locking devices that render them inoperable when children could have access.
- Ammunition should be stored separately in locked, tamper-proof containers.
- The law is designed to prevent accidental access by children and reduce the risk of firearm-related injuries or deaths.

Annual Notice Requirement

Beginning **October 1, 2025**, and each October thereafter, all Michigan schools are required by law (MCL 380.1313b) to distribute firearm safety storage information to families. This ensures all households with children receive current information about safe storage practices and their legal responsibilities.

Why Secure Storage Matters

Safe firearm storage helps prevent tragedies by reducing the risk of unintentional shootings, youth suicides, and firearm thefts. Families play an essential role in protecting children by modeling responsible firearm practices and by engaging in age-appropriate conversations about what to do if a child encounters an unsecured gun.

Recommended Safety Practices

- Safely Store Firearms: Always store firearms unloaded in a locked cabinet, safe, vault, or storage case.
- Safely Store Ammunition: Keep ammunition in a separate locked container.

- Secure Firearms: Use trigger locks or cable locks to prevent use when stored.
- Talk with Children: Discuss the dangers of firearms and what to do if they come across an unsecured gun.
